## Are you thinking of having a new vehicle crossover?

A vehicle crossover is the link from your property over the footway (pavement) to the highway (road).

### New regulations

The government guidance for vehicle crossovers was changed in May 2007, so that the Highway Authority (Essex County Council) must ensure that the number of access points to the highway is kept to a minimum. **Second crossovers will not be allowed except in exceptional safety cases.** You may apply for a replacement for the first crossover where necessary, but the first crossover must be blocked up.

### Points to consider

- Do you need planning permission? In some cases such as on to a classified road, across an open space, possibly in a conservation area – this will be determined by the planning authority – Chelmsford Borough Council.
- There are fees payable to cover the administration (They may be waived for disabled applicants). The cost of the crossover, including moving any street furniture e.g lampposts must be met by the householder.
- The Highways Authority will only allow crossovers in safe places.
- Depending on circumstances, the works can be arranged by the householder using an approved contractor or by the Essex County Council.

### Consult first

I recommend that before you commit yourself to any significant expenditure, that you consult the Mid Area Highways Office of the Essex County Council, 2, Dukes Way Chelmsford, CM2 6PS – [highways.midarea@essexcc.gov.uk](mailto:highways.midarea@essexcc.gov.uk) . Almost always a sketch map of the proposals would be required.

### **Are you an unpaid carer?**

Maldon Carers Centre is a local charity offering information, support and respite for unpaid carers in the Maldon, Chelmsford and Braintree areas.

All carers regardless of age, sex or circumstances feel the need for help at some time or other. They may feel isolated, anxious, in need of support, or simply require information and we may be able to help.

Our carer support workers can offer confidential one-to-one support at our Maldon office, one of our outreach respite centres, in the comfort of your own home or a location to suit you. We are approved by Essex County Council to offer carer support.

### **The Carers Group**

We run a successful carers group in Chelmsford where carers can meet each other and chat, take part in social and pampering events or obtain information as well as emotional and social support from one of our carer support workers.

Currently, this group meets on the third Tuesday of the month from 2pm until 3.30pm at the Kathy Mapes ( Age Concern) Day Centre in Cottage Place, Chelmsford which is just behind the cathedral.

### **Breaks for carers**

We can also offer carers a break by looking after their cared-for in one of our outreach respite centres in Chelmsford.

These take place in St Augustine's Parish Hall, Beardsley Drive, North Springfield from 11 am until 2.30pm on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month and at Meadgate Church Centre, Meadgate Avenue, Great Baddow from 11am until 2.30pm on the first and third Wednesdays of each month.

Both centres offer a welcoming atmosphere and disabled access.

Carers can opt to leave their cared-for with our trained care staff to enjoy refreshments (we ask that cared-for bring a packed lunch with them) and activities such as games as well as a chance to socialise.

If carers wish to stay, they are very welcome to do so and can talk to our carer support worker.

### **For young carers**

In addition, we operate a Young Carers Project for children and young people aged 8 to 18 with caring responsibilities. There are regular club nights in Chelmsford as well as trips to London and places of interest during the school holidays.

## Is the caller at your door genuine?

Of course, most callers are honest people, but if you don't recognise them, there is a small chance that they are up to no good. To prevent bogus callers getting the better of you, there are three keywords to remember:

**STOP! CHAIN! CHECK!**

For more information continue reading below:

- Before you answer your front door, make sure the back door is locked. Thieves sometimes work in pairs, with one entering the back door while the other one knocks on the front door.
- If you are at all unsure about a caller, never let them in no matter what they say.
- Talk to people through the door rather than opening it.
- It isn't rude to make someone stand on the doorstep while you check they are who they say they are. If a caller claims to be from an organisation, call them to double check.
- Fit secure window and door locks.
- If you have elderly neighbours keep an eye on who is going to their door. If their garden is untidy – one of the clues bogus callers look for – you could offer to tidy it up for them.
- If you have elderly relatives, remind them of the stop, chain, check message when you see them.
