

## **Notes on NAP Meeting for Great Baddow & Galleywood held in the Millennium Centre, Great Baddow, at 7.30 pm on Wednesday 10th February 2016**

**Present:** Richard Beck (Chairman), Maureen Miller, Trevor Miller, Chris Shaw, Andrew Sosin, Bob Clarke, Dan Glading.

**1. Apologies:** Jenny Chandler, Bob Hendrie. No apologies or report had been received from the police.

**2. Minutes of the meeting on 28th October 2015** were agreed.

Disappointment was expressed that there had been no contact from the police whatsoever, particularly in view of events that had taken place in Great Baddow since the last meeting.

### **3. Youth Facility**

The drop-in centre was now unable to use Marrable House. Work had started on clearing the old building and planning permission had just been granted for demolition and rebuilding. After some negotiation, it had proved possible to accommodate a drop-in session at the Bell Centre on a Wednesday evening from 5pm to 7pm, before a longstanding existing hirer came in at 7.30pm. The re-timing of the drop-in session may have been a reason why Mike Humphrey had not been able to attend this meeting.

### **4. Highways and Traffic Problems**

Footways in Gilmore Way were in the process of being resurfaced.

Andrew Sosin reported that the police were no longer taking action on obstruction on highways.

### **5. Current Community Police Status**

No further information had been received. It was possible that some PCSO posts would be able to be reprieved due to some more money being made available, but this was not known. The Neighbourhood Police website still showed a PCSO in post for both Great Baddow and Galleywood.

### **6. Policing Incidents and Issues.**

No information had been received from the police.

A multi-agency meeting had been held in Great Baddow at the end of November 2015 and notes of this meeting are available on the news page of the Great Baddow Parish Council website.

Dan Glading reported that the latest hot spots memo received by Neighbourhood Watch showed no burglaries in Great Baddow.

## **7. Priorities**

It was agreed that these would remain as before:

1. Drugs in Great Baddow;
2. Speeding, especially in Galleywood Road, Beehive Lane (including the section near Slades Lane), Barnard Road (particularly outside schools), Baddow Road, Church Street, Maldon Road, Longmead Avenue.

## **8. Any other business**

1. Richard had attended a meeting with the police, 'Partners Forum on Rural Crime', held by the RCCE (Rural Community Council for Essex) on 27th January. He will circulate the minutes. Members were unclear which areas of Chelmsford were classified as rural.
